

### **Greening Australia**

We have an ongoing and beneficial community partnership with Greening Australia. This is a true partnership as it benefits both parties. The following paragraph is a short summary by **Max** and **Bryn** from Year 6, giving you a snapshot of how this school partnership operates.

Every Friday at lunch time a group of students volunteer to help with various tasks at the organisation, Greening Australia. These tasks can be anything from sorting and stacking pots to labelling plants or even filling trolleys with countless trays. During our time at Greening Australia, we have learned how to work more efficiently as a team and work with people we don't regularly work with. We have been rewarded with the knowledge that we have helped make the country a little bit greener.

### **Student Transitions**

The one thing we can be certain of is change. We try to prepare and support students at the many transition points throughout their schooling. Preschool to primary school and primary school to high school are two clearly defined transition points in students' schooling. Planned visits to the primary school from the preschool involve our preschool classes regularly visiting the library, the gym, the canteen and the Kindergarten classes, as well as social interactions with their Year 5/6 buddies. These visits help our preschool students become familiar with their surrounds and to feel supported in the routines and expectations of the kindergarten year they will enter. Likewise, our Year 6 students participate in several information sessions and school visits to orientate them to the timetables, routines and opportunities the high school setting offers.
